- Order numbers from the smallest to the largest
- Recognise odd and even numbers
- Sort numbers into thousands, hundreds, tens and units (x2, x3, x5, x10).
- Use their times tables to solve problems.
- Tell the time on a digital and analogue clock and interpret calendars and timetables.
- Problem solve, discussing and showing how they found the solution and identifying when a number sentence is incorrect
- Recognise the steps needed and the correct information they need to complete a task or to reach a conclusion.
