Success Criteria:

Is your child able to...?

- Use factual language for the purpose of writing information sheets, instructions and recounting events?
- Write creatively e.g. write a diary of a Celt, a dialogue and a simple story (or part of)?
- Use interesting openers and connectives to vary their sentences?
- Read fluently, with expression and meaning?
- Respond confidently to Welsh and English texts orally and in written form using reasoning, prediction, skimming and scanning skills?
- Speak and listen purposefully, for example to discuss a book, express their opinion or to complete group-work, recalling previous learning.
- Use your digital skills to work and communicate safely online?

Numeracy

Success Criteria:

Is your child able to...?

- Recall tables 2; 3;4; 5;6 and 10 (and beyond) quickly and correctly, & use them to solve simple multiplication and division problems?
- Solve “real life” problems which include numbers, money, time and measurements?
- Present data in the form of Venn or Carroll diagrams?
- Use different combinations of money to pay for items up to £2/£10 and calculate the change?
- Say what area and perimeter is and calculate for simple shapes?
- Calculate fractions of numbers, using their times tables facts to help? (e.g. 1/4 of 20 is 5).
- Read five-minute/minute intervals on analogue and digital clocks?
- Recognise and categorise 2D and 3D shapes?
